

Let's walk in the past!

Bleurville (E3): former Benedictin Saint-Maur Abbey with a Carolingian crypt dating from the X century

Châtillon-sur-Saône (D6): jArchitectural jewel dating from the Renaissance (hotels with turrets, armored doors, mullioned windows). Eight renowned buildings: salt attic, Sandrecourt hotel, Huge Tower.

Darney (F3): Saint-Madeleine Church, museums, Guillevic Estate (a query with modern sculptures), prehistoric center, pedestrian circuits in the forest.

Escles (H2): Saint-Martin vale, hermitage, chapel and sculptures belonging to the Pierre-Avenir association.

Esley (F1): Roman crypt dating from the XII century.

Martigny-les-Bains (C3): Therms dating from the XIX century (hotels and fountains buildings from 1882, registered as a Baltard XIX century monument).

Martinville (E5): Roman church (XI and XVII century) with wooden altarpiece.

Monthureux-sur-Saône (E4): Ruins of Celtic Roman castle, church with wooden polychrome tomb from the XVe century. (Rhenan school).

Relanges (E2): XI century church, Bonneval and oppidum and chapel.

Saint-Baslemont (E2): XVI century castle, distillery and goat cheese factory

Les Thons (D5): Former Cordeliers convent from the XV century, wonderful pigeon loft, XV century Petit Thon church with a very beautiful statuary, presbytery with turrets.

Serécourt (C4): Fortified churches with bretteice.

Tignécourt (D4): Notre-Dame-de-l'Assomption de Flabémont Abbey dating from the XII century.

Vallée de l'Ourche (F4) between the Clairey glass museum and the Cistercian Abbey in Droiteval, going by the arboretum in La Hutte.

Damblain (A3), **Lamarche** (B3) (XII^e, XVI^e, XVIII^e century), **Martigny-les-Bains** (C3), **Saint-Julien** (D4): Registered churches.

Châtillon-sur-Saône (D6), **Godoncourt** (D5), **Martinville** (E5), **Morizécourt** (C3), **Saint-Julien** (D4), **Serécourt** (C4): Traditional Lorraine villages, outstanding mansions, carved, lintels, awnings, wash houses, *égayoirs* (horse baths)...



Grandrupt-de-Bains (H3): Maquis monument.

Godoncourt (D5): XII and XVI century church and former XIX century convent.

Isches (C4): Fortified churches and XV century frescoes.

Lamarche (B3): graveyard and amazing tombstones.

Famous people

Abbé ÉTIENNE (XIIe century): Monk founder of the Flabémont Abbey.

André-Marie BARBIER (born in 1885, died in 1962 in Darney): he was a veterinarian, and member of parliament, sénateur des Vosges. Gave his name to a square in Darney.

Famille BRIOT (XVIIe et XVIIIe century, Damblain): coin and medal engravers.

Jean CARMIGNAC (1919-1986): abbot. His house was in Marey.

Marie Louise DAMIEN dite **DAMIA** (1889-1978): thirties singer whose grand parents lived in Darney. DAMIA Museum in Darney.

Louis DUBOIS (XVIIIe century Flabémont): XVIIIe architect Flabémont monastery, Gate of St-Baslemont castle, Darney collegiate church.

Ferdinand FARNIER (died in 1924 in Robécourt): director of a bell foundry factory in Robécourt.

Jean-Baptiste GERDOLLE (1696-1770 à Lamarche): sculptor master, cabinet maker. A Plate in Darney church.

JANNEL FRÈRES wheelwrighter ans blacksmith. Factory and museum in Martinville.

François Théodore LEGRAS (born in Claudon en 1839): Art Nouveau glass master worker. Plate in maison de la Grande Catherine, glasswork in the museum in Hennezel.

Charles LEGROS (1769-1842 à Darney): officer, Empire knight. Plate on the Château de Darney.

Famille de LIGNEVILLE, or de Lignville: XIX century house in Châtillon-sur-Saône.

Jan MONCHABLON born in Châtillon-sur-Saône in 1854): painter. Statue and paintings in Châtillon-sur-Saône.

Claude-Victor PERRIN (born in Lamarche en 1764): Duc de Bellune, empire maréchal. Square and statue in Lamarche.

Hubert PONSCARME (born in Belmont-lès-Darney en 1827): sculptor, engraver and medal maker. Fountain and plate in Belmont-lès-Darney.

Charles et Paul RENARD (born in Damblain en 1847 et 1854): aviation pioneers. Monument and street in Lamarche

Yvon SALMON dit **Victor NOIR** (born in Attigny in 1848): journalist. House and stone in Attigny

Guillaume de SANDRÉCOURT: House in Châtillon-sur-Saône

Pierre WOIRIOT - Engraver (born in 1532, lived and died in Damblain in 1599). Lord estate dating from the XIX century in Damblain (not opened to the public), plate on the front dating from 1379.

Must see

Each summer, outdoor show of the Châtillon museum and The Odyssée company as well as the Natur'images Festival in Tignécourt.

Jobs and professions

Stones

Stone work in **Bleurville** (E3) where variegated sandstone is used by craftsmen (buildings patrimony).

Stonework with sculptures in **Darney** (F3) contemporary.

Art cutlery

Cutlery factory in **Darney** (F3) whose production is to be found on the most prestigious tables. Goldsmith since 1862.

Visiting spa towns

Naturally beneficial, **Vittel**, **Contrexéville**, **Plombières-les-Bains** et **Bains-les-Bains** offer their reputation along this road which contributes to the fate of the Vosgian therms.

Going away from that huge sanstone shelf by the D164 road, through the legendary Darney forest, the smaller roads also bring you to **Martigny-les-Bains**, a quaint town which was famous for its springs.

At the extreme side of Lorraine, **Bourbonne-les-Bains** (Haute-Marne) et **Luxeuil-les-Bains** (Haute-Saône), are renowned spa resorts.

The richness of our territory fulfils the well-being you will feel during your sojourn.

Around water

You can find numerous wash houses, fountains and *égayoirs* on the territory. Beautiful bridges are also to be found (Claudon, Monthureux, Attigny, Lamarche...), mills (Viviers, Isches, Rocourt, Ainville...) and former blacksmith's shops (Hennezel, Claudon).

Three streams water the territory: the Saône which originates from Vioménil, the Madon which originates from Escles, and the Mouzon which originates from Martigny-les-Bains.

Les Vosges, southbound

The South west part of the Vosges is geologically constituted of a secondary formed shelf and leans on a primary formed mountain. It generously displays extremely different landscapes which creates a rare diversity of atmospheres.



Covered with an impassable forest which was a border between three Gallic peoples, our region has become opened and welcoming. Situated at the end of the water divide between the North Sea and the Mediteranean, this territory which has several springs also has an endearing rurality, a real authenticity and an exciting history.

This past is told to us through its heritage, displayed and unveiled as we visit its remnants and secrets. Indeed we can hear the sounds of former activities going across its vales. Chapels and churches, castles and fortified buildings, hermitages and monasteries, and especially traditional villages make the cultural and architectural attic of the South West part of the Vosges.

What common point can we find in the bell foundry in Robécourt and the ancient blacksmith's shops, between the limestone lawned landscapes of Lironcourt and the Darney forest? From this stunning places spring wild range where mildness, colours and lights follow you in your walks and escape.

Food and traditions

Cheese

Tasting delicious and authentic, they are the ambassadors of authentic food. These traditionally made cheese (Emmental, goat cheese, fresh and ripened cheese), can be discovered at producers' in Isches, in Relanges, in Saint-Baslemont, but also in Hennezel, Blevaincourt and in Provenchères-lès-Darney...

Honey

The quality of Vosges honey is guaranteed by a registered designation of origin « miel des Vosges Plaine » and « miel des Vosges Sapin ». Several beekeepers offer honey from various origins (acacia, blackberry...) on the territory: Attigny, Châtillon-sur-Saône, Hennezel, Martigny-les-Bains, Monthureux-sur-Saône, Mont-lès-Lamarche, Rozières-sur-Mouzon, Saint-Baslemont...



Alcohol and beer

The full range of alcohol show the skills of distillers whose flagship is « Mirabelle de Lorraine » (registered name) in Saint-Baslemont. The beer from Ville-sur-Illon at the border of the northern territory perpetuates the tradition of craft brewery. Consumed with moderation !



Fruit

Fruit from the Vosges in Hennezel (picking) and mirabelles from Lorraine. A producer in Grignoncourt sells apple, pear, cherry, quince juice... you can also pick fruit according to the seasons.

Sweets

Taste the mysterious Vosgian sweet (of traditional craftsmanship) and discover how sweets are made from sugar at Delisvosges in Darney.

Other delicacies

Snails, pâté lorrain, quiche lorraine, traditionally baked bread, pudding, pork meats... Our local producers will make you discover numerous artisanal products.

You can also be welcomed in educational farms to visit and or buy delicacies.
